End of Year Reports – What to Expect

Dear Parents,

Once a year parents are presented with a final summary report on their child(ren). The report is part of the ongoing process of communicating with parents about their child's progress during the year. As such, it should be seen as part of the sequence of teacher/parent evenings held every term and follow on from the mid-term report you received in March.

This report provides you with information on your child's progress in Core National Curriculum subjects studied: Reading, Writing and Maths and his/her attendance record. The format of the report is designed to provide you with a summary of your child's attainment in the various aspects of work he/she has followed during the year. For each subject the teacher has given an attainment statement and an attitude to learning grade.

The attainment statement is a teacher assessment based upon your child's National Curriculum for their age. The report uses four statements, within the table below:

The attitude to learning grade is based on the following characteristics which are crucial to successful learning. **We would always urge parents to encourage high grades here, focussing praise on the effort's children make with their learning.**

You will receive your child's end of year report in the week commencing **4th July**.

This report is for you to keep as a permanent record of your child's attainment at school in 2021/22.

For children with SEND who are working below their Age Related Expectations, the report will look a little different. This is because these pupils are assessed against our SEND Toolkit which aids our teachers in meeting the learning needs of all our pupils. More information on this is provided within the report to assist parents in understanding their child's current attainment.

If you wish to discuss the report with your child's class teacher or myself you will be able to do so at the next parents evening scheduled for the week commencing **11th July** or contact the school for a separate appointment.
