Remote Learning

Dear Parents/Carers,

Following the Prime Minister's announcement last night, you will have heard that school will, sadly, be closing until February Half Term. Only children whose parents have jobs which class them as critical workers will be able to attend school from tomorrow and access in-house provision.

Due to this, a robust and comprehensive home-learning plan has been put together for those children who will need to access their learning remotely which will support children in having the best possible start to the term given these new challenges.


Your child's class teacher will be in contact with you via Class Dojo over the course of the term to provide you with timetables and outlines of the online provision for your child over the coming weeks. Please ensure that you are checking your child's Class Dojo page regularly for these as well as any updates specific to their class. Teachers will devise online lessons, in line with the national curriculum, which will consist of a blended variety of resources, for example: daily live lessons for Maths and English via Zoom; independent work and/or challenges set on Class Dojo; Spelling Shed; TTRockstars; website resources; pre-recorded lessons; non-screen and other activities. A limited supply of technology support is available from the school upon request, should you need it.

School will be providing Remote Learning Journals for all children to record their learning in, and will again be organising year group home-learning packs for all children. Year group packs will be emailed to parents so that they can be printed off at home if possible and copies of these will be printed off and made available for collection, if needed. Remote Learning Journals and home-learning packs will be ready for parents to collect from 10:00 tomorrow and will be available for collection outside the office, at your convenience, during the school hours throughout the week. We kindly ask parents to avoid collecting books during drop-off and pick-up times for our key worker and vulnerable pupils to minimise on-site traffic and to limit the number of people queueing/gathering at any one time.

Our children had a very successful term of learning last term thanks to the dedication and excellent teamwork of our staff, parents, governors and children. I know that you will continue to support the staff and the school to keep our children and our community safe, motivated and positive.
