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Results from our Remote Education Survey

Dear Parents,

I am delighted to share the outcome of our recent Remote Education Survey with you. Our sample was larger than we had expected with nearly 100 responses received in total which equates to a third of our families. During this lockdown we have seen on average 30% attendance in school which equates to approximately 130 children.

Those families whose children are attending school were asked not to respond to this survey.

Thank you to those of you who took the time to add additional comments; we were touched by so many of them. It certainly does give us the motivation to continue to raise standards in every area, helping our children to continue a momentum of remote learning until Monday 8th March when all our children will be able to return to school. Like you, we want the very best for our children.

We were also particularly pleased with parent perception of our live lessons and our systems around feedback. As I am sure you can imagine this is difficult to measure from the other side of the screen.

Here is a summary of the results:

94% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that as a school we had been clear about our expectations of a NPS Remote Education.

87% of parents said that their children were accessing the remote learning package daily.

90% of parents said that the live Zoom lessons have been extremely helpful and beneficial to their children.

84% said that their child's learning had been supported extremely well during this lockdown.

81% of parents said that the weekly learning packs were extremely easy to use and supported the live lessons well.

94% of parents said that it was extremely easy to contact either the school or class teachers to ask questions and/or seek additional support.

87% of parents said that the feedback that their child has received during their lessons and from their uploaded work has been extremely helpful.

This feedback helps with our evaluation cycle so thank you again for your input in this. Our priority is always to take the school forward recognising the current strengths as well as addressing areas where the school needs to improve. We value your input in this.

As we begin to pull together plans for the full return to school on Monday 8th March, we feel confident that we have a strong contingency plan in place should there be the need to close bubbles or respond to any changes in restrictions.
